What is going on with this weather?! We have had record rainfall, snow, and flooding. And who can even count the number of atmospheric rivers? I had never heard of an atmospheric river until this year. According to the National Weather Service, "Atmospheric rivers are relatively narrow regions in the atmosphere that are responsible for most of the transport of water vapor from the tropics." Now we know! Southern California has been hit with flooded roadways, landslides,

mudslides, and fallen trees. San Bernardino county residents have been trapped due to the extreme amounts of snow. Homes have been threatened, damaged, and even destroyed. Power outages and evacuations have almost become a way of life. The news is filled with the hardships people have been facing.
















LEAF Scholarship Applications are Available Online! Deadline to apply is April 17, 2023

financial need, letters of recommendation, and GPA in their major.
