This is especially important in San Diego County where the value of the dirt, where plants and housing both reside, has risen by such amounts. If we all decide together, we can create this reality.

With a heavy heart, we announce the death of two long-time CLCA members.



John Marman

John Marman, the Vice President of Sales and Marketing at West Coast Turf, passed away suddenly and unexpectedly on Aug. 14, 2022. He was 51.

Marman worked for West Coast Turf for 27 years, starting right after graduating from the University California, Riverside. of His sister Danielle, then the

marketing and PR director, convinced company president John Foster to "hire her little brother to work in the sod fields." Marman worked his way up the company ladder in the intervening years, spending many years in the WCT Las Vegas office, eventually becoming regional manager, until his promotion to VP of Sales and Marketing in 2015.

In a statement, John Foster said, "The West Coast Turf Family has suffered a tragic loss. John Marman, our VP of Sales and Marketing has passed away...He leaves behind his sister Danielle Scardino, sister Sue Hanks, and his 11-year-old son Knox, the light of his life. He was a friend to all. There are no words that can describe the terrible grief and pain his loss brings to all of us in the West Coast Turf family."

The list of projects Marman helped with is long, including numerous Super Bowls and World Series, the Rose Bowl, Dodger Stadium, Angel Stadium, the LA Coliseum, Candlestick Park, and even a trip to Singapore to work on natural grass projects.

He spent many years of service on the Certification Board of Governors of the Golf Course Builders Association of America (GCBAA), was a member of the Sports Field Managers Association, California Landscape Contractors Association, Golf Course Superintendents Association, and started the Nevada Landscape Association with the late Barry Mohon, his mentor. He also loved to speak at conferences, including last year's Golf Inc. Summit.

His family requests that remembrances be made in the form of a tribute gift to Sticks for Kids or St. Edwards the Confessor Parish School.



Nelson Colvin

Nelson Colvin, past CLCA State President and CLCA Life Member, passed away on August 25, 2022, at the age of 83.

Colvin held numerous positions in CLCA, including San Fernando Valley Chapter President, state Director of Events, and state President. He was honored as CLCA's 1980

Associate Member of the Year. In 1979, the Auxiliary named him a Knight of the Gartner, and in 1990 he was presented an Allegiance Award, the association's most prestigious accolade.

He served several terms as CLCA's Director of Events, where he championed the Trophy Awards as a celebration of excellence in landscaping. When he stepped down as Director of Events, the Humanitarian Award was renamed in his honor.

Elizabeth Burns, CLCA's 2022 Director of Events, noted that Nelson's "passionate involvement in the CLCA led to many lifelong friendships. Nelson was known for his wonderful sense of humor and his impish grin."

"If you knew Nelson," she said, "he loved planning our events for the association, as he took such pride in it, especially if he had a special little something up his sleeve."

Act Now to Avoid Bond Surprise

Act now to avoid starting the new year with an unpleasant surprise following the expiration of your state-mandated bonds. That's the recommendation of CLCA Insurance Solutions.

Starting January 1, 2023, the Contractors State License Board will increase all bond limits from \$15,000 to \$25,000. This includes contractor license bonds and RMO bonds. The increase was the result of Senate Bill 607, which Gov. Newsom signed into law in September, 2021. The purpose of this bill is to protect consumers and ensure that contractors have enough financial backing to complete a project.

Most surety companies are expected to automatically

increase a contractor's bond and invoice for the difference in premium. If the invoice is not

paid, the surety company will shorten the term, rather than cancel the bond. If the surety company sets your bond to expire sooner, you will need to renew sooner. Contact your insurance agent to ensure that your premiums and records are up-to-date. Otherwise, surprise!

Overseeding Your Lawn for Fall

Temperatures are still warm in Southern California, but fall is here. It's time to start preparing your lawn for the new season. Once temperatures do cool down, it's the perfect time for grass to recover and prepare itself for winter. Below are some tips on overseeding your grass for fall from West Coast Turf's Mr. Wise Grass.

First things first... when to start overseeding. According to WCT's experts, the ideal time for overseeding is when nighttime temperatures get down lower, like in the 60s. Typically, this happens in October.

Next, know how low you should scalp your grass prior to overseeding. The height of your grass isn't the important issue as much as opening the turf canopy. If you mow the grass shorter, the turf canopy will be tighter, which will result in the need to verticut more aggressively. The standard recommendation is to not cut the grass lower than half an inch. If you scalp the sod too low, you will cause long-term problems to the grass.


Many people ask if it's ok to use annual ryegrass, rather than perennial ryegrass. Annual ryegrass has a much lower cost than perennial ryegrass, but it's not ideal for a winter overseed. If you use annual ryegrass, you will get a thinner grass blade and a slightly chlorotic look compared to perennial ryegrass. It also grows much taller (and faster) than perennial ryegrass, which results in more frequent mowing. This isn't where to cut costs! Stick to perennial ryegrass for optimal winter overseeding.

Choosing the right seed is important. It's tempting to go with the cheapest option, but it's a bad idea. Seed can contain a variety of weed seeds, off types, and poor germination rates, so you need to be careful. We recommend a perennial ryegrass with zero percent weed seed, 90% or more germination, and very little inert matter.

It's important to keep the seed wet. This usually consists of 3-4 cycles for around 5-10 minutes per cycle. The water doesn't need to puddle or saturate the ground, simply keep the seed wet. Irrigation systems vary so watch your sprinklers and run the first couple cycles to check coverage and to keep it from puddling.
